Her hulls and flybridge were also recently painted making her look like a new boat! Recently detailed from bow to stern Catbo is ready to head to the Bahamas. She truly is a turnkey boat just waiting for her next owners!

For those who have been following the PDQ, you know what a following this boat has gained. Serious cruisers have realized this boat is "it" and would talk to you for hours about its positive attributes. The comfort, space, and fuel economy found in such a manageable footprint, make the PDQ 34 an obvious choice. Vessel Walk-thru & Accommodations

Entering through the glass sliding door aft, you step down into the spacious Salon including the Lower Helm Station with seat...Moving forward, the salon is centerline with a large U-shaped lounge and table that converts into a King Size berth...The Galley is down and midship in the port side hull along with one Stateroom aft...The Head & Shower is down and forward in the starboard side along with the Master Stateroom aft...Throughout the boat teak and holly flooring makes for a homey feel...Storage is also abundant with tons of cabinets and under floor dry storage The Topsides include an enormous Flybridge area with Upper Helm Station, numerous storage lockers, wide walk-arounds and Transom Stairs on each hull...A swim ladder on the port side makes getting in and out of the water a breeze!

Galley

The Galley is well laid out and uses its space very efficiently...It is located midship in the port hull...The Galley is open to the Salon and Dinette area and provides good ventilation and ease in socializing with people in the Salon while performing Galley chores...

Salon

The Salon area of the MV/34 is one of her most appreciated features...With lots of large windows, excellent ventilation and comfortable seating, she is hard to beat...The Dinette Table drops down and makes a large almost king size berth...The seating back in front of galley can be removed to provide a nice pass through and more visibility into the galley.

Staterooms

Each Stateroom features a Queen Size Berth, ventilation hatches and opening ports, large hanging & storage lockers... With the aft hatch open PDQ 34 offers the most airy aft stateroom to be found on any catamaran.

Head & Shower

The Head is located on the Starboard Side forward...It contains convenient storage spaces, electric toilet and the separate stall shower...the head uses fresh water flush and has upgraded hoses to eliminate odor.

Electrical System

The PDQ 34 is extremely well equipped from an electrical standpoint. The heart of the system is a 5 KW northern Lights generator for 120V support and a large 12V House battery bank (420AH AGM). All wiring on the boat is very professionally installed and easy to access. When new systems are installed all old wiring has been removed.

Engine & Mechanical

The MV/34 is powered by Twin 75HP Yanmar Diesels...This provides cruise speed of 13-15 knts and a fuel burn of about 4.0-4.5 GPH. The engine areas have been well maintained. With only 1934 hours they are barely broken in.

The PDQ 34 features dry bilges due to the use of the Tides dripless shaft seals. These are excellent items and work really well.

Electronics

The owner installed a complete set of Raymarine electronics. 12" Axiom on the flybridge, 9" Axiom at the lower helm, Quantum Digital radar, AIS transceiver, Icom VHF with remote mic.

With the new electronics they added exhaust temp and high water bilge alarms that are wired into the MFD's with the analog to digital converter listed below.

They also had the temperature, oil pressure and tachometers wired in to the MFD's. It required a Actisense EMU-1 to convert analog signals to NIEMA 2000 digital data. This provides access to gauges at the upper station now right on the MFD including tachometers should a problem occur with the analog gauges.

The Flybridge has a beautiful layout...A wide array of cushions allow for large group seating...The Radar Mast and Bimini Top can easily be dropped down by one person for cruising under low structures...

Final Comments

Catbo is a beautiful 2006 example of these great cruising boats. With the 75HP engines she is extremely economical to run but still has a top speed of 17Knts.

Hulls and more

Catbo was completely painted by Huckins Yacht in Jacksonville in 2020. All external white fiberglass (except underneath between the hulls) was painted with AlexSeal. This includes the seating area and helm of the flybridge. All deck surface was painted as well. The owner is regularly asked if it is a brand new boat. Appearance wise, it stands out from all other PDQ's we have seen.
